### “Notes 4 Tomorrow” At Howard’s Club H Sets Schedule For 10 Performer Lineup

**Bowling Green, Ohio, April 13, 2026** — This Saturday, April 18, Howard’s Club H, in downtown Bowling Green presents *Notes 4 Tomorrow*, a benefit concert supporting The Joseph Wolph Foundation for Music Education. The show is like a festival, promoted as “10 bands for 10 Bucks,” and all admittance proceeds support the foundation’s mission to fund music educators’ needs in Northwest Ohio.

Organizers Glenn Burris, a Wolph Foundation board member, and Steve Feehan, the owner of Howard’s, have announced the performance schedule. Opening the show, at 7 PM, will be a special appearance by Leadfoot Granny with veteran Toledo musician Mark Mikel. Leadfoot Granny is one of the most promising young rock bands to come from the Northwest Ohio area in many years, earning raves from the area press and soon to appear at Pittsburgh’s Three Rivers Arts Festival. Their self-titled debut album, produced by Mikel with the assistance of major music industry names, is on major streaming platforms.

Toledo songwriter Greg Dale will step to the mic next, at 7:30, in a rare solo appearance. Penny and The Frets follow at 7:45, and the 8:15 slot will feature Toledo’s most prominent ‘sacred steel’ performers, Nikki D. and The Sisters of Thunder, who have recently returned from European performances.

Laurie Swyers and New Moon bring their popular blues and folk infused sound to the *Notes 4 Tomorrow* stage next, on the schedule for 8:45 PM. Bowling Green-based rockers Milk On The Rocks are booked for the next slot, around 9:15 PM. Another in-demand Toledo ensemble, Chloe and The Steel Strings, will follow, with an expected start time of 9:45. Their 45-minute set will overlap with I their friend and Toledo area mainstay performer Jeff Stewart, who will join The Steel Strings and then play solo.

Dangerbelly will take the 10:45 slot, offering a one-hour set featuring their own vintage-rock feel songs and favored covers. Wrapping the night will be Steve Feehan himself. From the piano, Feehan will lead a debut performance of the new Howard’s Club Band until closing time.

Toledo comedian, actor, and filmmaker Tom Hofbauer has the duty of MC for the night. “I use a lot of music in my own performances, and of course, somebody taught me to sing, play guitar,” Hofbauer said. “Right now, music education stands too far back in the line. *Notes 4 Tomorrow* is a chance to rally the troops, get a lot of great local musicians in one place, help the cause. I’m thrilled to play a part.”

The Joseph Wolph Foundation has supported local music programs with nearly \$20,000 in grants since 2021, funding instrument replacement, marching band projects, scholarships and other needs. *Notes 4 Tomorrow* is the first benefit performance by local musicians in support of The Wolph Foundation. Sponsors for the night include Reineke Family Dealerships, For Keeps, The Cigar Affair, MP Media, Bigfoot Studios, and The Bowling Green Community Foundation.

Burris thanked Howard’s for hosting the show. “If B.G. has a downtown institution, it’s Howard’s. The club will be 100 years old soon and has seen thousands of musicians since the great Luther Allison played the first live music in Howard’s, back in 1974. Ten bands in one night? I don’t think that’s ever happened. We’re grateful to see so much local talent jump to our aid. Having a first-class venue makes it all so much easier.”

*Notes 4 Tomorrow* is an all-ages show, and Howard’s Club H is at 210 N. Main Street in Bowling Green.
